Frank Lee Leebrick Sr. and Clara Marie [DeLorme] Leebrick (Jan. 13, 1893 - Mar. 28, 1967) (Nov. 7, 1903 - Apr. 16, 1963)

Frank Lee Leebrick was born in <u>Lynchburg</u>, <u>Virginia</u>, in 1894. He was married to **Clara Marie DeLorme** for forty-three years, until *Clara's* death in 1963. *Frank*, a veteran of WWI, died at the Soldiers' Home in Washington, DC, in 1967, and is buried in <u>Arlington National Cemetery</u>, along with his wife *Clara*, in Arlington, Virginia.





Frank was a Sergeant in the US Cavalry (1911-1925). He was a champion horseman who served in France in WWI. He was later a West Virginia motor policeman, volunteer fireman and gentleman farmer.







John Nicholas Leebrick Sr. [Sept. 19, 1897 – Feb. 16, 1967]

John Nicholas Leebrick Sr. was born in Virginia on 19 Sept. 1897. He was married to *Ruby Elizabeth Melrose*. He appeared on the census on 9 Jun 1900 in Brookville Twp W.D., Campbell Co, Va. and

on the census in 1910 in Lynchburg, Campbell Co, Va. Age given as 12 years old.

He served in the military on 12 Sep 1918 in Lynchburg, Campbell Co, Va. as a truck driver. He appeared on the census on 17 Jan 1920 in Lynchburg, Campbell Co, Va. He appeared on the census in 1930 in Hyattsville, Prince George Co, Md. He is buried in *Springhill Cemetery* in *Lynchburg Va*.

He died in Feb 1967 in Maryland. Last known address was Baltimore; Baltimore County, Md. Data from SS files was issued before 1951 in the District of Columbia. His residence was in zip code 21233. He was a clerk in the DC area in the 1942-1945 time periods. [He was the brother of Wayne's adoptive grandfather *Frank Lee LEEBRICK*.]

John and his wife **Ruby** had three sons -John Nicholas LEEBRICK Jr., Clyde Wallace LEEBRICK, Ernest Edward LEEBRICK - and one daughter **Doris Elizabeth LEEBRICK**.



William Henry Leebrick (March 15, 1850 - January 2, 1932)

William Henry Leebrick was born in Virginia in 1850. He was married to Lilly Woody and *Ida Thompson*. According to family sources, *William* had as many as twenty or more children with his wives, many of whom were twins or triplets and who died at birth or in early infancy.

William and Lilly had two boys—William Henry, Jr. and James and a girl, Mary.

William and **Ida** had seven boys and a girl. The boys' names were Bland, Joseph, <u>Frank Lee</u>, <u>John</u> **Nicholas**, Tinsley, Jennings Bryant, and Richard. Lelia was their daughter's name.

George D. Leebrick (1821 - 1853?)

George D. Leebrick (note the change in the spelling of the surname) was born in 1821, probably in Nelson County, Virginia. He was married to **Nancy Kidd** on Nov. 18, 1841.

George D. and **Nancy** had five children, four sons—Micajah, **William Henry**, James N., John D. and one daughter—Angeline.

Daniel Henry Liebrich (May 30, 1773 - 1839)

Daniel Henry Liebrich was born in Manheim, Pennsylvania, in 1773. He was married two times—to **Elizabeth Peters** and Nancy Tinsley.

They had ten children, four sons—Samuel Peter, Nicholas, Frederick and *George D.* and six daughters, Louisa Anna, Catherine Ann, Mariah, Angelina, Sarah, and Caroline.

John Philip Nicholas Liebrich (Mar. 3, 1747 - Apr. 24, 1788)

John Philip Nicholas Liebrich was born in Mannheim, Germany, in 1747. He arrived in Philadelphia on September 25, 1754, on the ship "Adventure" from Hamburg, Germany, with his father, <u>Johannes Philip</u>.

John and his wife, **Catharine Frank**, were married in Dauphin County, Pennsylvania. They lived in Manheim, Lancaster County, Pennsylvania, and had nine children, among them four sons—John, **Daniel Henry**, John Philip and George—and five daughters—Ann Margaret, Elizabeth, Catherine, Maria, and Salome.

Johannes Philip Liebrich (January 15, 1702 - September 17, 1785)

Johannes Philip Liebrich was born in Mannheim, Germany, on January 15, 1702 (or 1696, depending on which document you believe). He arrived in Philadelphia on September 25, 1754, on the ship "Adventure" from Hamburg, Germany.

John and his wife, Catharine Hansin, had (at least) five children, including a son, John Philip Nicholas Liebrich, born in 1748, and four daughters. The first daughter was Apollonia, who married Valentine Gardner; the second was Mary Elizabeth, who married Daniel Newman on December 15, 1775; the third, Hannetta, who married Charles Wilsbach, and the fourth, Margaret, who married Daniel Briligam.
